God is everywhere.. Even in the small things that we do...

A couple of weeks ago Jan Bennett from Horsehay, kindly came into the office to bring me some wool, so I could make a dementia blanket. (I'm learning to crotchet). She also brought in some lovely squares, and rectangles that her Mum, Lona Hutchins had knitted.

Lona was diagnosed with Alzheimer's 5-6 years ago then, sadly, by the time Covid had done its thing, she had gradually lost her ability to knit and crochet and she never felt able to go back to the Craft Group at Dawley Baptist Church which she had really enjoyed going to. Lona would have been 93 in a couple of weeks' time but sadly passed away in March.

Jan Broome from our Crafty Lot Group came in to see me with a beautiful blanket that she had knitted for us to pass on to Sylvia Bailey at Oakengates who is collecting granny blankets for the dementia patients in our local hospital. Whilst we chatted I had a light bulb moment... so off I went to have a rummage in my cupboard and I found the squares and rectangles that Jan had passed on to me and Jan (Broome) was very happy to accept the challenge of putting them together to make a blanket, which she did, in less than two weeks!

I sent Jan (Bennett) a photo of the finished blanket and she was thrilled to see her Mum's squares all beautifully put together and as we knew it would have sentimental value, we did ask Jan if she would like to keep it, but she said no, her Mum had made the squares with the intention of a blanket being made for the dementia patients, so in the near future this very special blanket will find it's way to Sylvia, who will ensure that it finds it's way to the local dementia ward. The rectangle ones are a bit more of a challenge, but they will get done.

Jan (Bennett) said she knows her Mum would be thrilled to know the squares have finally been used, so it's a lovely tribute to her and a fitting end for her squares, that they have been made into such a beautiful blanket and hopefully will help and give comfort to someone's suffering from this dreadful disease.

I passed Jan (Bennett's) email onto Jan (Broome) who was thrilled that her blanket had brought joy to the first Jan. So my point of the story is how the kindness we shared between us had led to a beautiful blanket being made. My lightbulb moment didn't come from me, I know that.. It was the Spirit talking to me and saying pass those squares onto Jan. All I had to do was listen and obey. Between us, by giving and sharing we have a beautiful blanket that is going to be appreciated by someone else, that we don't even know, but that doesn't matter, because we still care about them, and we are showing God's love to them through our acts of kindness.

Latest news from John Fletcher of Madeley Primary School

Hello Everyone,

I think it's time for an update!

School life continues apace, and I've been spending more time with the younger children in Key Stage 1(Infants) I'm now a familiar face at that end of school and regularly visit the Resource Base (our school unit for children with complex needs) on Mondays where we sing together for about half an hour. This is followed by music and storytelling in The Nest (our nurture unit) and Language Class. We talk about Gods Love and say prayers together.

Year 1 also enjoy my visits and I tend to elaborate on the assembly theme that morning and we have Question and Answer Sessions. Our latest discussion was on the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost with sound effects and speaking in different languages! The children enter into these discussions with gusto.

The Lent Bags went well with Year 2 and we ended up with both classes making them to take home. These are the instructions sent with each bag: (I thought you might be interested to read)

Lent in a Bag

How to use this bag....

Lent is a season when many people focus on growing their faith in God.

Lent is also when we think about our own journey of faith.

Week 1: STONE (log slice) Hold it in your hand.

Jesus went into the wilderness and was very hungry. He was tempted to turn stones into bread. He stood firm and said that bread isn't the most important thing. God's word is.

Hold the log slice and think about something you find difficult. Ask God to show you how to handle the problem.

Week 2: Teardrop Hold it in your hand.

What makes you sad right now? Something in your family or friends or the world. Pray for the situation you are thinking about.

Week 3: Compost and the seed Plant the seed ball in the soil.

As you plant it think about your faith and ask God to help it to grow. Look after your little pot and water it every week. Watch the seed grow into a plant.

Week 4: Rose petal Think about mothers as you hold the petal. Think about Mary the mother of Jesus and say thank you for all mothers. Thank God for His love. Thank Him for the people who love and care for you.

Week 5 The candle. Light it up! Spend time looking at the candle. Think about how much Jesus loves you and what He did for you. His love for you is a shining light.







The children really enjoyed this activity and the rest of Key Stage 1 have asked for it to be repeated next Lent, but I think it could be used also for a season like Advent so watch this space!

Reception children visit me every Monday morning in the Den and we have a session together with prayers and singing. This last term we are talking about Hope and how God gives us hope through Jesus. We love our sessions together and I get asked some interesting questions like 'Why do you believe in God and does God really love me?'

Stay n Pray is every Monday lunchtime and we have enjoyed talking, praying and reading together as well as crafting. We follow the church lectionary and are just about to create a new display on 'I am the Vine. You are the branches' Rev Marcus visited us a few weeks back and was placed in the 'Hot Seat' in assembly. He bravely answered questions from Year 5 and there were some tough ones! Well done Rev Marcus! Come back and visit us again!

Friday Meditation continues with the lectio 365 readings, and a new rug has been gifted! A small group of children really appreciate this ministry with one or two staff members joining in on occasion.

I have been working on the Prayer Garden and Dobbies have again generously donated some plants. In addition we have three beautiful wooden signs and the children are in the midst of an art project for the garden. Its to be in the shape of a butterfly.

We met for Prayer in March at school with several of the circuit members and were very happy to be joined by our Assistant headteacher Sarah.

It is great to know I'm supported by circuit members, and I feel in these days that prayer for this school work is vital to see it flourish!

Please continue to pray as school faces some major staff changes from September as teachers move on. Please pray as I attempt to share Gods Love and Promises with children and staff.. that there may be a renewed interest in the gospel . Please pray for peace, care and respect to blossom in our school. Pray that Gods Word would not return to Him empty and that any new staff might be active Christians! That would be awesome!!

I've been invited to take part in the local Anglican church Year 6 transition Day on June 25th. This is to be held at St Michaels Madeley and is for all year 6 classes in local schools who are moving on to secondary schools in September. Your prayers are appreciated for that day too.


