




Questions to ponder today:






We are excited to share our theme for Lent 2025, 'Soul Food'

Total cost: £3500—£4000 (depending on exchange rates)





World Water Day

World Water Day, held on 22
March every year since 1993,
is an annual United Nations
Observance focusing on the
importance of
freshwater. Preachers and
Worship Leaders could use this
as a theme for a sermon or talk
in the following weeks. It fits into the Methodist Way of Life in
the 'Flourish' station, where we
do what we can to protect the



environment and remember that we are a part of it.

World Water Day celebrates water and raises awareness of the 2.2 billion people living without access to safe water. It is about taking action to tackle the global water crisis. A core focus of World Water Day is to support the achievement of Sustainable Development Goal 6: water and sanitation for all by 2030.

Every year, the UN's coordination mechanism on water and sanitation sets the theme for World Water Day. In 2025, the theme will be Glacier Preservation.

Glaciers are melting faster than ever.

As the planet gets hotter, our frozen world is shrinking, making the water cycle more unpredictable.

For billions of people, meltwater flows are changing, causing floods, droughts, landslides and sea level rise.

Countless communities and ecosystems are at risk of devastation.

As we work together to mitigate and adapt to climate change, glacier preservation is a top priority.

We must reduce greenhouse gas emissions to slow down glacial retreat.

We must manage meltwater more sustainably.


Wednesday 5th, 12th, 19th & 26th March And 2nd and 9th April between 12:30-2:30pm

Exploring different aspects of life's decisions through biblical passages and personal experiences, the six weekly sessions include prayers, activities, discussion questions, meditations, suggestions for further reading and ideas for action. This course offers an opportunity to reflect on the challenge of Lent and the decisions God calls us to make.


