#### Meeting Father Salmon—A new novel by John Parkin

To believe or not to believe? The question that lies at the heart of this story of two men. Brought together by chocolate brownies on the motorway, they embark on a series of conversations in which they explore their relationship to religious belief.

To walk towards faith or to walk away from it? Which will they choose?

John explains: "This project started as a personal exploration of whether to hold on to religious faith in modern life, leading to the question of what happens if it is discarded. What do we accidentally lose, both as individuals and society, if we allow the echo of faith to drain away to nothing?"


Richard lives with Michelle and their young family in a new residential estate, typical of those that have appeared across the UK. Richard appears to live a perfectly ordinary, untroubled, upwardly mobile life, but he wrestles with the challenges of work, family, and finding meaning in modern

life. Richard's first impression of Salmon is as an anachronistic, God-obsessed, mystical crank. However, he becomes increasingly intrigued by his very different way of thinking and living.

As their conversations progress, Richard and Salmon find themselves exploring whether faith in God offers anything beneficial to a regular person in modern Britain. Richard is attracted to Salmon's solidity, but we discover Salmon is grappling with his own challenges following the death of his life-long companion. Salmon is acutely aware that what Richard is drawn to might be a mirage, the shadow of a faith that is draining away."

#### **District Pilgrimage in Easter Week**

In our open-air communion this year we shared in telling the events of Easter from memory. As we did so our own pilgrimage experiences became intertwined with the biblical narratives. We were there. For five years our District has enjoyed a pilgrimage in Easter Week, with participants from the Birmingham District joining us for the past three years. Lay and ordained, we explore different parts of the District walking about 10 miles a day between chapels in which we reflect, pray, cook and sleep. We had some great conversations, times of walking in silence, and reflecting on God's beautiful creation.

In our evening devotions this year, we were led in a theme of making our mark using simple artwork. Mornings were led by different volunteers. I was particularly struck by a quotation from a book by James Norbury: 'Which is more important', asked Big Panda, 'the journey or the destination?' 'The company', said Tiny Dragon. The destination this year was Church Stretton, and the journey was over too soon as the company had proved to be so good.

Then choose we shall, the crag or road, Each stone or curve a sacred ode. Through jagged rock or softer bend, We walk as pilgrims, friend with friend.


The Stiperstones may stretch our pace, But joy is found in every place.



Cartway, Bridgnorth has 3 bibles study groups.


Shambles Group meet on 2nd Monday of the month at 10:30am
