God of all grace,


we thank you that in every generation you reveal your love for the world, and set before your people your word of life and hope.

Christian Aid Week

This week is Christian Aid Week, May 11-17, when supporters from all over the UK come together to find different ways of raising funds and awareness for the work of the organisation's local partners, empowering communities around the world to find practical and sustainable ways out of poverty.

The President and Vice-President of the Methodist Conference are encouraging people to take part.

Revd Helen Cameron said: "The work of Christian Aid in alleviating poverty globally is more important than ever."

Vice President, Carolyn Godfrey added: "Christian Aid continues to be a beacon of hope for communities around the world facing poverty, injustice, and crisis. Christian Aid's focus on addressing the root causes of inequality—whether through climate justice, advocating for human rights, or supporting local communities in the face of disasters—shows their dedication to creating a more just and compassionate world."

This year, the charity – which is marking its 80th anniversary – is focussing its flagship appeal on



work in Guatemala, in Central America, where climate change is causing the seasons to intensify and shift erratically.

As a result, farming communities have to battle severe floods and, more recently, ferocious heatwaves. Water sources are drying up and vital crops are failing, plunging farming families into hunger and poverty.

Amelia is 24 and a mother of two from the Alta Verapaz region. She said the situation is very worrying: "In the past three years, we have been experiencing high heat and a lack of rain. One of the biggest issues is the lack of water...My plantations have been dying... and there is no food for my family."

Despite the challenges families are facing, the unstoppable power of hope drives people to look for ways to push back.

Christian Aid has been working with organisations like, Coordinación de ONG y Cooperativas, to offer training and tools so farmers can diversify and grow more resilient crops, build water recycling systems, and create organic fertiliser.

When Amelia discovered these initiatives, she put herself forward as a community representative, attending training sessions and bringing the learning back, to train other women in her community. She also raises awareness about the environment, discouraging people from littering, and encouraging people not to sell their land.

Every year, Christian Aid shines a light on people like Amelia and the efforts of local organisations to work with them towards a better future.

And once more, church leaders up and down the country are supporting the work of the charity and the fundraising efforts of its amazing supporters in the UK.


Let all creation rejoice before the Lord! *Psalm 96: 13*

3Generate 2025

At the Circuit Children and Young People's Growth Group on 8th May we agreed we would like to send a Circuit Group to this year's 3Generate.

3Generate 2025 runs from 3rd October to 5th October and is at the NEC, Birmingham. There are several ways of attending. For C&YP between the ages of 8 to 17 they can attend for the whole weekend, with indoor camping for two nights. For C&YP between 4 and 7 there is the opportunity to attend with a significant adult on the Saturday only.

At this stage we are looking for people who can offer to be part of the group leadership team. There are four opportunities:

i) we need a Weekend Main Group Leader who will have overall responsibility for the camping group. The person with this role will be responsible for the whole group and will need to attend the leaders' training calls, do the risk assessment, and be responsible for managing the other Group Leaders

ii) Weekend Group Leader - this role works as part of the team under the direction of the Main Group Leader. They will camp for two nights in the Circuit zone and be responsible for the welfare and safety of the C&YP.

iii) Saturday Main Group Leader - this role will organise the group of younger C&YP who will attend on the Saturday.

iv) Saturday Volunteer - this role will help with the transport and care of the C&YP who attend on the Saturday.

All of the above roles will require Advanced Safeguarding and a DBS that is valid for working with C&YP to be in place no later than one month before the 3Generate event.

Wolverhampton & Shrewsbury District Chair's Travels - Rev. Rachel Parkinson

A return on Sunday to the Dunwell Ghanaian Methodist Church in the Telford Circuit. Each time I visit, the life of the church has developed in some way. The choir now have very smart robes (complete with mortar boards!) and there are now Women's and Men's Fellowship groups. I mentioned the very recent visit of the Methodist Church in Britain and Cliff College to Ghana - thinking it might come as news - but the congregation already knew all about it. They were also excited about the possibility of the first African Pope (who would then likely be Ghanian)sorry guys!

A joyful time as always. I preached on Jesus choosing both Peter and Saul as leaders of the early Church....certainly not the candidates that would first come to mind on the basis of their past behaviour. I imagine this is a fairly standard approach to take when preaching these passages....but it becomes more complex when you put this into the context of the Theology of Safeguarding. How do we both honour God's radical ways of choosing unlikely leaders but also recognise our responsibility to create spaces that are as safe as possible for everyone, and especially the most vulnerable amongst us? It's a tension worth thinking about.


