Holocaust Memorial Day January 27th

6 million Jews were murdered in the Holocaust. The Nazis gave them numbers, but each person had a name.

Emanuel Benisch and Olga Benischova were two of those murdered. They were my grandparents. We were brought up knowing nothing about them. We always wondered why our mother had been allowed to marry our father when she was only 17 and they had no common language. We learnt decades later that it had been a way of getting her out of Prague on a British passport. Dad was a journalist covering the rise of Hitler. As children we weren't allowed to know we were Jewish, but we knew we weren't allowed to go to Church Parade with Cubs or Brownies. We knew our grandparents had died of starvation, but our questions about why were always brushed aside.

When our mother died, we did a bit of investigating and discovered that we could have memorials in Prague for our grandparents called Stolpersteine (Stumblestones), two cobbles with their names, year of birth and year and place of deportation and murder inscribed and set into the pavement outside their house. A house nearby had 8 stones outside, all the same family, including children.

We learnt that it is our generation, Holocaust descendants, that is making sure that grandparents are not forgotten and that the horrors of the Holocaust are neither forgotten nor repeated. The theme of this year's Holocaust Memorial Day is Bridging Generations. The generation in between often cannot articulate what they know.

Did you know...

Aviation is responsible for around 3.5% of global carbon emissions
(and less than 20% of the world's population has ever been on a plane)
Only 10% flights from the UK are business flights. The vast majority (63%) are for holidays and 25% to see friends and family.
Cutting one flight would save more CO2 than becoming vegan for a year.
Carbon offset schemes are not always effective, and they are unlikely to absorb all of the carbon from your flight – especially as there's no guarantee that the trees we plant today will still be here in 30 years' time.

At a time of dark, cold days and bad weather, many of us are thinking ahead to sunnier places to go on holiday... but could you pledge to do this without flying? 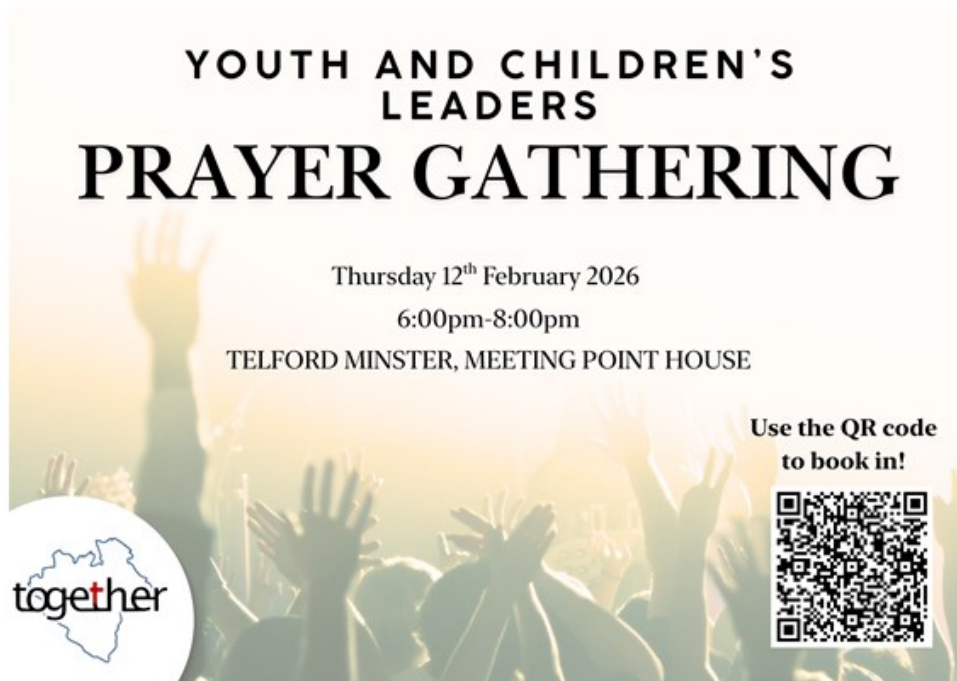

Job Description for a Circuit Steward



The circuit stewards are responsible, with the Superintendent and presbyters, deacons and probationers appointed to the Circuit, for the spiritual and material well-being of the Circuit, and for upholding and acting upon the decisions of the Circuit Meeting

What does a Circuit Steward do?

Circuit Stewards work as a team and share collective responsibility for leadership. This means that they should exercise a general pastoral care for the ministers (presbyters and deacons) and their families. They should meet with as a Circuit Leadership Team and keep themselves informed of the activities of each local church. Circuit Stewards will be appointed to attend church councils' meetings of allocated churches in the circuit. They will be members of the Circuit Meeting and shall take a lead in the occasional process of invitation of ministers (presbyters and deacons)

A Circuit Steward will be helped to become aware of District and Connexional policies affecting the circuit and its churches. This will enable them to play their part in developing a vision and plans for mission within the circuit, ensuring appropriate consultation.

What kind of person becomes a Circuit Steward?

A Circuit Steward is a member of a local church who senses a calling and has a commitment to serve the wider Circuit. They will be willing to be supportive and affirming of others. A Circuit Stewards will need to have personal credibility, be confident, committed, and willing to work in a voluntary capacity. They will be willing to work in a team and bring a contribution to the collective work. A Circuit Steward needs to be confident in engaging with the needs of the Circuit, being an agent of change where necessary. They do not need to have all the answers, or to be an expert, but they do need to be willing to learn and develop and to have a sense of when and where to ask for further help.

What Support will I be given in becoming a Circuit Steward?

The Methodist Church is committed to supporting all those who give their time in important roles within our churches and circuits. The Connexional Learning Team offers initial training and continuous support for those who serve as Circuit Stewards. A Circuit Stewards' Handbook has been produced which outlines the various tasks and skills required in the role.

How do I indicate my interest in becoming a Circuit Steward?

There is a requirement for us to follow our Connexional safer recruitment policies and so we shall need some information from you and you will need to have an up-to-date DBS disclosure. Once you have expressed your interest, your name will be taken to the Circuit Meeting for appointment. We are looking for a Circuit Steward to join the Circuit Leadership Tea, from 1 September 2026. If appointed ahead of that time, the chosen person can have a transition period, running alongside the outgoing Circuit Steward.

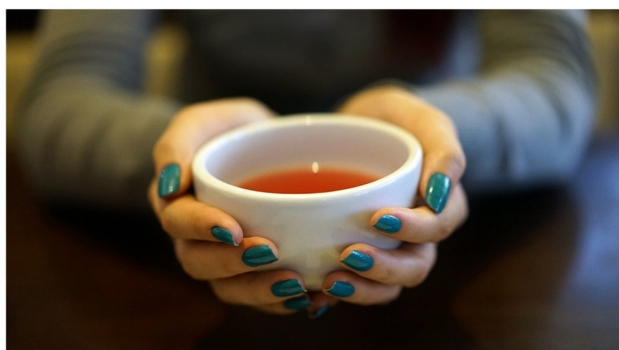

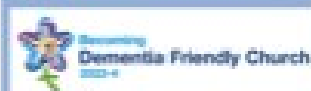
