Some news of our Superintendent.

Those of you who regularly receive news from the Methodist Connexion will have recently seen an announcement concerning our Superintendent Minister, the Revd Dr Adrian Burdon. The announcement tells that Adrian has recently been designated as the next Moderator of Churches Together in Britain and Ireland. The way that the announcement has been written by the Methodist Media Department reads as if this is a fulltime post which will take Adrian away from his current post. Whilst it is a significant and exciting appointment, it is not fulltime and will not take Adrian away from his current post as Superintendent of the Telford Circuit. Methodist Ministers (Presbyters and Deacons) do often get called to work for the wider Methodist Church at a District or Connexional level and sometimes, like this, in ecumenical contexts. Churches Together in Britain and Ireland (CTBI) is the umbrella organisation which works above the national ecumenical bodies, Churches Together in England and its equivalent bodies in Scotland, Wales and Ireland. You may know of CTBI through its organisation of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, Racial Justice Week, Black History Month and Education, to name but some of its work. The day-to-day work of CTBI is undertaken by a fulltime Director and Deputy Director. The role of the Moderator of CTBI is a bit like being President of the Conference only in an ecumenical setting. In this role Adrian will be responsible for supporting the Director and her Deputy in the work by chairing the main Board of the organisation, advocating for the work amongst the churches of Britain and Ireland and, occasionally, showing up at significant events in the life of the four nations. People linked to the West Midlands District are invited to join a "pilgrim community" of up to 12 people this Easter week on a route in the beautiful Golden Valley in Herefordshire, gathering in Hereford on the evening of Easter Sunday and finishing in Hereford the following Friday. Hereford is accessible by train. During this six-day experience, we will walk, pray and eat together and share sleeping space in a number of Methodist and Anglican Churches. Luggage (including your airbed / camp-bed and bedding) will be transferred each day. Mileage will be around 7 to 11 miles, taken at a gentle pace on rural routes that may include stiles.

We share cooking within the group.

This is now a "tried and tested" formula which has been greatly appreciated by previous pilgrims. Being willing to be part of a short-term community is far more important than being super-fit, providing you can manage a modest amount of walking over a number of consecutive days, followed by nights on a church floor! The pilgrimage will be led by a small team of previous pilgrims.

If means allow, we suggest a contribution of £140 to the kitty to cover food, accommodation and luggage transfer. Unfortunately, the living arrangements mean we cannot include children and young people, though they will be welcome to join us as accompanied day walkers (details later).

Covenants and Resolutions for 2026

In January every year Methodists across the Connexion renew our commitment to God in the Covenant service. During the service we confess that, among other things, we have misused God’s gifts, evaded our responsibilities and failed to be good stewards of His creation. We then renew our promise to seek and do God’s perfect will, freely and wholeheartedly yielding ourselves to God’s pleasure and disposal. Perhaps this might be an appropriate time to recommit ourselves to caring for God’s creation and to choose a church Eco-Resolution? Here are some possibilities to consider...

1) Appoint an individual, or ideally a group, in your church to spearhead your ‘green’ initiative and register for the A Rocha Eco Church programme. It’s easy to take part and as an Eco Church, you will be able to access a wide range of resources to help you to implement green initiatives and reduce the carbon footprint of your church.

2) Include regular topics in your worship and teaching relating to caring for God’s creation and the environment.


3) Investigate opportunities for reducing the carbon footprint of your church buildings and set targets for carbon reduction. This could include improving energy and water efficiency, investing in renewable energy technologies, reducing transport emissions, purchasing green energy supplies and offsetting any remaining carbon emissions. 4) Ensure that food, drink and other purchases supplied to church premises are produced in ethical and sustainable ways and use Fairtrade products where possible.

What is the Methodist
Covenant Service?




What is the Covenant Service?

The covenant service, often celebrated on the first Sunday of the year, is at the heart of Methodists' devotion and discipleship, and our dedication in working for social justice.

In the service the Church joyfully celebrates God's gracious offer that He loves us unconditionally, no strings attached.



The Covenant is the means of grace by which we accept the relationship and then seek to sustain it - not acquiring a relationship with God but living in it.



The Covenant is not a contract in which God and human beings agree to provide particular goods and services for each other.






Where did it begin?

The Covenant was key to John Wesley's understanding of discipleship as a Christian. He believed that we need to not only accept a relationship with God but also to grow in that relationship.

He saw a need for a regular opportunity for people to open themselves to God more fully. He looked for a way to help them to hear God's offer and challenge ever more deeply, and to allow God to prompt and enable them to respond.





Wesley's original Covenant Services were set in a framework of pastoral care, preaching and guidance that would continue through ongoing support for individuals and groups, as they were adapted from the Puritan tradition of pastoral and spiritual guidance.




Today, the service follows a set structure based on these original services including prayers, scripture, hymns, Communion, and the reading of the Covenant which the congregation say aloud together. All are welcome to these services - for the first time, the first time in a long time, or simply to watch what others do without taking part.

God's gracious offer to us is also a challenge.

Are we prepared to commit ourselves in return to God and how can we manage to live out our commitment adequately, frail and human as we are?

Dawley Christian Centre had their Covenant Service during the morning of Sunday 4th January 2026.

They were joined by their Anglican friends from Holy Trinity Church, Dawley and it was a lovely service.


Rev Nik Wooller delivered a wonderful sermon and the hymns certainly raised our spirits.







Job Description for a Circuit Steward



The circuit stewards are responsible, with the Superintendent and presbyters, deacons and probationers appointed to the Circuit, for the spiritual and material well-being of the Circuit, and for upholding and acting upon the decisions of the Circuit Meeting

What does a Circuit Steward do?

Circuit Stewards work as a team and share collective responsibility for leadership. This means that they should exercise a general pastoral care for the ministers (presbyters and deacons) and their families. They should meet with as a Circuit Leadership Team and keep themselves informed of the activities of each local church. Circuit Stewards will be appointed to attend church councils' meetings of allocated churches in the circuit. They will be members of the Circuit Meeting and shall take a lead in the occasional process of invitation of ministers (presbyters and deacons)

A Circuit Steward will be helped to become aware of District and Connexional policies affecting the circuit and its churches. This will enable them to play their part in developing a vision and plans for mission within the circuit, ensuring appropriate consultation.

What kind of person becomes a Circuit Steward?

A Circuit Steward is a member of a local church who senses a calling and has a commitment to serve the wider Circuit. They will be willing to be supportive and affirming of others. A Circuit Stewards will need to have personal credibility, be confident, committed, and willing to work in a voluntary capacity. They will be willing to work in a team and bring a contribution to the collective work. A Circuit Steward needs to be confident in engaging with the needs of the Circuit, being an agent of change where necessary. They do not need to have all the answers, or to be an expert, but they do need to be willing to learn and develop and to have a sense of when and where to ask for further help.

What Support will I be given in becoming a Circuit Steward?

The Methodist Church is committed to supporting all those who give their time in important roles within our churches and circuits. The Connexional Learning Team offers initial training and continuous support for those who serve as Circuit Stewards. A Circuit Stewards' Handbook has been produced which outlines the various tasks and skills required in the role.

There is a requirement for us to follow our Connexional safer recruitment policies and so we shall need some information from you and you will need to have an up-to-date DBS disclosure. Once you have expressed your interest, your name will be taken to the Circuit Meeting for appointment. We are looking for a Circuit Steward to join the Circuit Leadership Tea, from 1 September 2026. If appointed ahead of that time, the chosen person can have a transition period, running alongside the outgoing Circuit Steward.



Creating Safer Space: Who Needs to Attend Safeguarding Training?

As Circuit Safeguarding Officer, I've recently had a number of questions about who needs to complete which level of safeguarding training. To help clarify things, I've put together a guide outlining which people in which roles are required to undertake either the Foundation Module or the Advanced (Leadership) Module of the Creating Safer Space training.

The aim is to support all churches in ensuring the right people access the right level of training – helping us to build safe, welcoming communities for all.

Foundation Module

This is the essential safeguarding training for those who work directly with children, young people, or vulnerable adults in any capacity within the church.

Depending on your role – and if needed – you can then progress to complete the Advanced (Leadership) Module.

Required to attend:

- Active presbyters and deacons
- Pre-ordination students and probationers
- Lay employees and volunteers with pastoral responsibility
- Pastoral visitors
- Anyone working with 0–18s in the name of the church
- Those involved in activities targeted at vulnerable adults (e.g. lunch clubs)
- Church and circuit stewards
- Local preachers and worship leaders (including those in training)
- Safeguarding representatives / committee members
- Choir/music/drama leaders where children or vulnerable adults are involved
- 'Covenant of Care' group members
- Students undertaking Mission Placements

Young leaders (aged 16–18)

Warmly invited (but not required):

- Mission/evangelism enablers
- Leaders of other groups using church premises with 0–18s or vulnerable adults
- Other group leaders working with vulnerable adults
- Property stewards and keyholders
- Caretakers
- Church/circuit meeting secretaries
- Administrators (church, circuit, or district)

Advanced (Leadership) Module

This module is for those in leadership or oversight roles, or those to whom others may go for advice, guidance, or decision-making in safeguarding matters. These individuals are expected to model good safeguarding practice and lead by example.

Required to attend:

- District, Circuit and Church Safeguarding Officers
- Members of District Safeguarding or Policy Committees
- All presbyters and deacons in active preaching or pastoral ministry (including relevant supernumeraries)
- Local preachers (including those on trial)
- Worship leaders (including those in training)
- Lay or employed leaders working directly with children, youth, or vulnerable adults
- Mentors for the Youth Participation Scheme
- Members of Connexional Complaints Panels, Discipline, Pastoral, and Appeals Committees
- Trainers who deliver the Foundation Module
- Those in pioneering, fresh expressions, or evangelism roles

Members of the Circuit or District Safeguarding Committee

Warmly invited (but not required):

- Supernumerary ministers not engaged in pastoral roles

Others in leadership or oversight roles who would benefit from deeper safeguarding understanding

Safeguarding Training Renewal – Every Four Years

All safeguarding training must be refreshed every four years — but only at the level appropriate to your role. If you have completed the Advanced (Leadership) Module, you only need to repeat the Advanced Module every four years — you do not need to redo the Foundation Module. If your role only requires the Foundation Module, then that is the course you repeat every four years. This ensures everyone stays up to date with safeguarding best practices relevant to their responsibilities. .
